Community Speedwatch

With the support of Liam Walker, our Oxfordshire County Councillor, Speedwatch may be returning to the area. Community Speedwatch is a national initiative where active members of local communities join with the support of the Police to monitor speeds of vehicles using speed detection devices.

Vehicles exceeding the speed limit are referred to the Police with the aim of educating drivers to reduce their speeds. In cases where education is blatantly ignored and evidence of repeat or excessive offences is collated (even across county borders), enforcement and prosecution follow.

This was followed by a 2-2 draw with second place Charlbury Town. In the Fred Ford Memorial Cup Hailey beat Kingham All Blacks 5-1. In the Oxfordshire Junior Shield Hailey lost in the first round to Oxford City FA team, The Original Swan, 4-2, who gained revenge for a defeat five years ago.

The reserve team beat top of the league Charlbury Town Reserves in controversial circumstances. Charlbury thought they had scored after a ball crossed the line and the goalkeeper clawed it back. 
