Planning applications submitted to WODC

1. Land south of Giernalls Rd

The previous application on this site for 25 houses was refused by WODC. The current application is for a closed development of 9 houses within the triangle. The new application has addressed most of the objections raised last year. Hailey Parish Council has decided not to object to this planning application but has requested the following conditions:

- the development is constructed as a Close with no access to neighbouring fields.
- Giernalls Rd is made good after construction.
- the bridleway is maintained.
- there is a speed limit of 20mph for lorries during construction.
- the PC recommends that the proportion of smaller houses is increased.

The PC will put in a S106 request for a contribution towards community facilities.

2. Land between Chapel Lane and Poffley End

The PC objects to this new planning application for three houses, on the same grounds as used for the previous application. **This application has been refused by WODC.**

3. Land between Priest Hill Lane and Charlbury Road

This is for the construction of up to 85 houses of which 40% will affordable housing. A public meeting will be held on Monday 5th June at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. Residents are invited to attend to discuss this proposal. The planning application will be discussed formally at the Parish Council meeting on Monday 12 th June.

Closing date for public comment on this application is 1st June 2017.

Occupation Lane

The PC has received many complaints about a gate which has been erected across Occupation Lane in New Yatt. This is known locally to be common land.

Objectors have declared that it is an historically well-known and well-used bridleway and that the public have the right to roam on public access land. The Gov.uk website states that where there is local tradition, there is a right of access.

Arguments for erecting the gate are that substantial sections of trees, bushes and hedges have been hacked down, disturbing wildlife and blocking ditches.

The PC is currently investigating this issue.
