Out and about around Hailey

Occupation Lane

This is still an ongoing issue. It is now in the hands of Oxfordshire County Council's Countryside Team. The Parish Council awaits their decision.

Village Hall

The Parish Council is seeking a local Quantity Surveyor/Architect to assist in exploring options for upgrading the Sports pavilion and the Village Hall (when the lease expires in a few years' time). Please contact the Parish Clerk if you know anyone who can help.

Hedges and trees

Most boundary hedges and trees, almost without exception, are the responsibility of the owner or occupier of the land they front. It is the landowner's responsibility to maintain boundary hedges and trees. Overgrown vegetation can pose a hazard to pedestrians and cyclists. Please check to see if any of your hedges or trees restricts the amount of space available on pavements and paths which are for people, not plants.

Flooding and Ditches

We are asking all landowners to take precautionary measures to ensure that all ditches and watercourses adjoining their land are clear. In many cases the verges and ditches are owned by the County Council BUT it is the clear responsibility of the landowner of the adjoining land to keep the ditches clear. Please work with us to reduce any future flooding.

Proposed roadworks through Hailey

During the summer, there were planned roadworks by Southern Gas which created a diversion through Delly End. Due to concern from residents, County Councillor Walker enabled the diversion to be changed; the new route includes Hanborough and Woodstock. However, other roadworks were already planned in the area so Southern Gas have postponed their work until next summer.

Infrastructure Planning Team

Whenever there is a housing development of more than 9 houses in the Parish there are funds available to develop our infrastructure (such as the Sports pavilion, Village Hall, leisure facilities etc.). A team is being formed to develop ideas, make plans and obtain cost estimates. If you would like to join the team, please contact the Parish Clerk.

Hailey Church is now closed for the purposes of Fixing the Floor, but this does not mean that the church will not continue to be very active. In fact, we shall be on the move to various venues in the village, and we do hope you will feel able to join us whenever and wherever you can.

Our regular Sunday 9.15am services will take place in Hailey School Hall, and we are very grateful to Debbie Davis and the School Governors for allowing this. There will be two exceptions to this......

Harvest Festival will take place in the barn at Swan Hall Farm on Sunday October 1st at 11am, followed immediately by a Bring and Share lunch. NB Change of time. Remembrance Sunday when we shall have our usual Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial at 9am. We will then cross the road to the garage, and we will hold our service in the showroom there. This may be a "First" for Hailey Garage, and we are very grateful to Mr and Mrs Jenkins for allowing us to have this arrangement. Other services will be as follows.....

Thursday 10am services will be held in Middletown Grange activity room **Evensong** at 6pm will be held at the Sidings at Middle Farm c/o the Drews **The Pet Service** on Sunday October 15th at 3.15pm will be at Witheridge Farm. It will be in a barn, and horses/ larger animals will be welcome in the farmyard too. Wrap up warm! Hot drinks will be served afterwards.

Lights of Remembrance on Friday 27th October will take place in the church yard as usual and we will hope to have a gazebo where we can serve some refreshments.

We need to point out that a great deal of work is being done in the church, and this requires access and egress for machinery and deliveries. Hence, there will be times when access to the church yard may have to be limited for health and safety purposes. We apologise for this but it is an inevitable consequence of the works. We would be grateful if you can pass this word around to others, not in the village, who visit the churchyard on a regular basis.

This whole endeavour is being masterminded by Michael Drew, and we owe him a huge debt of gratitude for the determination and persistence with which he has pursued things.

We also want to say a huge thank you to everyone who has supported the fundraising for Fix the Floor. It has been a great community venture, and we really hope that when this is all completed we shall have a wonderfully refreshed church, and a venue suitable for all sorts of events which will be available to all of us. It's all really rather exciting!

Oxfordshire County Council's DIY 1,2,3 for free scheme's changing

The current scheme which has been running at their Household Waste Recycling Centres for 15 years allowed residents to deposit up to three DIY waste items for free before being charged a small fee of £1 for each additional item.

From the 1st October 2017 this changes to a small fixed fee per item of £1.50 for most non-household or DIY items.

Residents can still deposit household waste for free at their local Household Waste Recycling Centre.

Hailey Church Fixing the Floor

Having had a successful summer of fund raising, culminating in the "Celebratory Evening at Witheridge" when we drew the Golden Tile, (winner Peter Smith) we are now confident enough of our Funds to start the work of replacing 3/5ths of the floor and relaying the original but cleaned off tiles, putting in a new loo on the new floor, upgrading the heating, resiting the Font, and building a new servery in the West End of our church.

By the time you read this St John's will be closed, we shall have started lifting the 4000 tiles to clean off, and the pews will have been stacked out of the way, ready for the contractor to come in early October and dig out 1/2 metre depth of spoil ready for a new Block and Beam Floor. Insulation and then a concrete screed on top should secure the floor of our village church for many generations.

We are aiming to be open again for the Chrismas services although due to the time taken for the floor to dry out before the tiles can be relaid, it may be on a temporary floor surface.

All this work and movement of heavy machinery will undoubtedly cause some disruption, materials are being moved via Church Lane, thanks to the Parish Council permission, and the understanding of Church Lane residents, but there will undoubtedly be some times when access to the Churchyard will be restricted, in addition to the Church being closed. We hope for both your understanding and patience whilst the work goes on.

We have saved our community a considerble sum of money by employing local contractors, by lifting the tiles and moving the pews as volunteers, and I still believe we can save more by undertaking the cleaning of the tiles ourselves. If any Hailey residents are interested in finding out what the task involves, please contact me on the above phone number.

From October 2017, households across the district will use wheelie bins for recycling, except for glass and small electrical items which will be collected in a black box.

In line with most other councils, recycling collections will become fortnightly and will alternate with the general household rubbish collection. However, food waste will continue to be collected weekly.

The new recycling bins have been delivered to householders during July and August. Look out for your recycling guide from 18 September This includes a bin collection calendar, starting from October 2017. Please check carefully in case your collection day has changed.

These calendars will remind you which bins to put out on what days and are especially helpful to find out any changes over the Christmas period and Bank Holidays.
