NOTICE OF REFERENDUM

HAILEY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN AREA

Referendum on the Hailey Neighbourhood Plan

1. REFERENDUM

A referendum will be held on **Thursday 29 August 2019** to decide the following question:

"Do you want West Oxfordshire District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Hailey to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?"

2. POLLING HOURS

Polling hours on Thursday 29 August will be between **7 am and 10 pm**.

3. APPLICATIONS TO VOTE BY POST OR PROXY

Applications to vote by post, or to vary or cancel existing postal or proxy voting arrangements, must reach the Electoral Registration Officer by **5 pm on Tuesday 13 August 2019**.

Applications to vote by proxy at this election must reach the Electoral Registration Officer by **5 pm on Tuesday 20 August 2019**.

Applications to vote by emergency proxy at this election on the grounds of physical incapacity or for work/service reasons must reach the Electoral Registration Officer by no later than **5 pm on Thursday 29 August 2019**. The physical incapacity must have occurred after **5pm on Tuesday 20 August 2019**. To apply on the grounds of work/service, the person must have become aware that they cannot go to the polling station in person after **5 pm on Tuesday 20 August 2019**.

All applications and notices regarding absent voting must be sent to the Electoral Registration Officer, Electoral Services Office, Council Offices, Woodgreen, Witney, Oxon, OX28 1NB . Application forms for postal and proxy voting are available from that address.

4. APPLICATIONS TO REGISTER TO VOTE

Applications to register to vote must reach the Electoral Registration Officer no later than 12 midnight on **Monday 12 August 2019**.



Hailey Neighbourhood Plan

PLEASE VOTE IN THE REFERENDUM ON 29TH AUGUST We have been working on the Neighbourhood Plan for over four years. There have been two consultations and the plan has been inspected by an independent examiner. The full plan can be inspected on our web site haileywestoxon.org.

The referendum question is:

Do you want West Oxfordshire District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Hailey to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?

If the majority of voters say YES, then there will be additional protection for many of our green spaces and for the gaps between Witney / Foxburrow / Hailey / Delly End / Poffley End. The plan does NOT identify any additional house building areas.

Needless to say, we urge you to vote YES.

Request for Bus shelter

As mentioned in the previous issue, the PC is investigating installing a bus shelter on the B4022 through the centre of the village. The footpath at the location of the current bus stop is not wide enough to site a shelter, so it would need to be moved several metres to the left, where the noticeboard is currently installed. The shelter would be made from wood.

If you have any objections to this, please send them in writing to the clerk by 5th September.

Hailey Parish Council Burial Ground

Relatives and Friends of those buried in the Parish Council Burial Ground are reminded that this is a Lawned Burial Ground, and that the planting of trees, shrubs, bulbs and flowers on the burial plot is not permitted. Likewise, after an initial 6-month period all other vases, memorials, etc., should be removed, and in order to ensure ease of mowing and tidiness the Parish Council reserve the right to dispose of any other items remaining on the burial plot.

Full details of these Regulations are available from the Parish Clerk whose contact details are above, as are the details regarding the eligibility and cost of reservation of Burial Plots.

Overflowing ditches

The PC has received complaints about overflowing ditches. Please ensure that any ditches on your land are cleared.
