It looks as though the football season is over due to Covid 19. Normally it would have ended by the last Saturday in April

Results wise, the first team have played two league games, both against Spartan Rangers home and away. Spartan Rangers have been unable to play any home games on their traditional home, the Leys, after the Town Council deemed the pitch dangerous and the changing facilities inadequate. I am surprised this decision was not taken years ago. As someone who umpires cricket I have seen members of the public wandering on to the outfield and in one case even a lady with a pram walking across the actual square while a game was in progress.

Spartan Rangers now play their home games on the all-weather pitch off Station Lane. Hailey won their away game 7-2 and the home game 4-2 in what could be the last game of the season. In the Oxfordshire Charity Cup, Hailey played Watlington, losing in a marathon penalty shoot out 19-18 after normal time ended 3-3 in spite of being reduced to ten men with a player sent off.

The reserves have played two games, losing to Enstone Sports 7-0 in the Junior Challenge Cup and beating Witney Royals in the league despite being reduced to ten men. The A team (third team) beat Sherborne Rovers 4-2 and Ascott 5-0

Firstly, THANK YOU

Support might include doing the shopping, collecting prescriptions, dog walking, agreeing regular phone calls, putting the bins out, providing information, etc. Please <u>TELEPHONE</u> the relevant Parish Councillor/s as shown in the box above so that a list of helpers can be drawn up. We will then agree with you how best to communicate and coordinate efforts.

Helpers will need to follow government advice on social distancing, etc.

North Witney And the Community Infrastructure Charge (CIL)

We had lots of plans to provide a set of Community facilities for the new N Witney development, such as a Community Centre, Health Centre, children's play areas, playing pitches and changing facilities, new footpaths and upgrading existing footpaths etc. etc. These plans are now under threat and we run the risk of acquiring a huge sterile housing estate with significantly reduced facilities. The above CIL charge on developers was planned to raise over£10 million for North Witney infrastructure BUT, WODC is now recommending that this levy be set to zero for N Witney and four other sites (including East Witney, Eynsham and Chipping Norton).

There will be a six-week consultation on this proposal. Once the consultation begins, we will let you know and ask you to object.

If you, your children or grandchildren eventually live in North Witney, wouldn't you expect decent facilities?

In addition, the Treasurer and Secretary have also announced that they will step down at the end of 2020. This leaves the Club with several openings to join the committee to kickstart activities after our enforced "rest" and bring in some fresh ideas.

In spite of cancelling the AGM, members can still view the Chair's report and the audited accounts on the website. The Secretary and Treasurer have agreed to stay in post until the end of the calendar year, at which time there will only be 2 active committee members without additional volunteers.

Unfortunately, the short answer is – nothing, for the foreseeable future. After receiving advice from our umbrella organisation Community First Oxfordshire, **the Village Hall closed on 18 March until the end of May initially**. The time period will remain under review but may have to be extended. Any events and bookings scheduled for this period have been cancelled and fees will be refunded. As well as classes and social events, this also included long-standing fixtures such as the Village Lunch and Coffee Mornings. These events attract many of our older residents, providing a regular contact opportunity for most. Without putting anyone at risk, now might be a good time to make sure your neighbour knows there's help available if needed.

Nobody knows when this will end. If we can, the Management Committee will take the opportunity to upgrade and refresh some of our fixtures. All emergency and outside lighting has already been upgraded. A new kitchen floor covering is scheduled, as is a coat of paint in the main hall (circumstances permitting). So when the doors open again, your hall will look a lot smarter inside, ready to cater for all your postponed celebrations. See you then.
