

Parish Council Vacancy

The PC is looking to fill a vacancy for the role of Parish Councillor. Recent Burglaries in the area

There has been a recent spate of burglaries across the area: in Chipping Norton, Charlbury, Ledwell, Stonesfield and

Long Hanborough. The burglars having been breaking through patio doors to gain entry to homes.

Homes with no security measures in place are five times more likely to be burgled than those with simple security measures. Good window locks and strong deadlocks can make a big difference. Please see the website for details on how to help keep your home safe.

Land West of Hailey Road - proposal for 110 houses

The Parish Council had an informal discussion with the developers. They intend to apply for planning permission on the above field (alongside Witney Community Primary School). This proposal would be part of the 1,400 houses included in the WODC Local Plan. The PC pointed out that they were unlikely to succeed unless an agreed masterplan for the whole of the North Witney site was in position.

The Councillors also emphasized that it is essential that a funding plan for the West End link road across the river is secured in order to avoid further aggravation of the Bridge Street Air Quality Management Area.

The developer has distributed leaflets on this proposed development in North Witney and Foxburrow, but not elsewhere in the parish.

Fancy growing your own veg?

We have three allotment plots available to rent. If you would like to take on a plot, then please get in touch with Lisa or Ann Gibson.

Hailey Parish Council gives notice as per the Allotments Acts 1908 to 1950: Rules as to Allotment Gardens, that two allotment plots are available to rent at Hemplands and one at Poffley End. The rent for these allotments is currently no more than £7 per annum. If there are more than two applicants eligible to become tenants and likely to keep the allotment garden in a proper state of cultivation, preference shall be given to an applicant who does not hold an allotment garden or agricultural land either from the Council or otherwise over an applicant who does hold such land, but if these do not apply, allotment plots shall be let to the applicant whose name is received first by the Council.

Hailey Parish residents can apply for an allotment, to the Parish Clerk by post only to Wyelands, Upper End, Shipton-u-Wychwood, OX7 6DP. Please state name, address and email address. Applications must be received by 5pm on 20th December 2019.
