CONSULTATION on NEW VILLAGE HALL

There is a 4 page consultation in this Hailey Herald which sets out some initial thoughts on the replacement for the Village Hall. Essentially it is a list of potential requirements prior to obtaining design options for the replacement building. Please read and let us know what you think. What, if anything should be added? How can it be improved?

50 houses off Priest Hill Lane (Sharba Homes)

The appeal against West Oxfordshire District Council's failure to give notice of its decision within the appropriate period for the planning application will be determined on the basis of an inquiry. An inspector will hold a Public Inquiry at The Council Chamber - Woodgreen on 29th January 2019 starting at 10:00 am. Members of the public may attend the inquiry and, with the agreement of the Inspector, will be allowed to give their views.

West Oxfordshire District Council Local Plan 2031

The Inspector has finally issued his report and WODC should have adopted their Local Plan 2031 by the time you read this. It includes a housing requirement for the period 2011 - 2031 of 15,950 new dwellings (INCLUDING THE NORTH WITNEY development of 1,400 houses to be built on the edge of Witney from the Hailey Road across the New Yatt Road to the Woodstock Road). The development also contains the West End Link Road / bridge from the end of Hailey Road across the river to the Burford Road and the Northern Distributor Road from Hailey Road to the Woodstock Road.

Hailey Neighbourhood Plan

Following the Inspectors report on WODC's Local Plan, Hailey Parish Council have formally submitted their Neighbourhood Plan. There will be a final consultation on the plan, probably beginning in October. 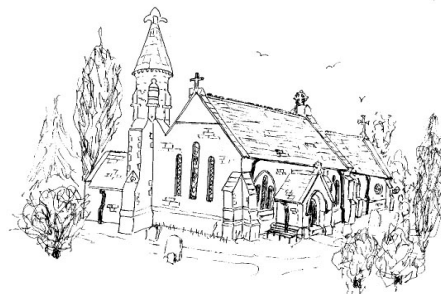

Centenary of the Armistice of WW1

As part of the nation's commemoration of the Centenary of the Armistice of WW1, Oxfordshire County Council is partnering with The Woodland Trust for a project of lasting remembrance. The Parish Council would like to plant a native species tree sapling which is being donated by the Woodland Trust alongside a plaque of commemoration.

The PC is planning a commemorative event involving the community to mark the planting of the sapling. It would like to plant the tree on Delly Green near to the Peace Memorial. If there are any objections to this, please send them to the clerk by 31st October.

New waste and recycling calendars now online

West Oxfordshire's new waste and recycling collection dates are now published for the next 12 months and can be viewed and downloaded online at

www.westoxon.gov.uk

As well as accessing online bin collection calendars, residents can register for handy weekly email alerts about waste collection dates, including a reminder the day before about which bins to put out and helpful information about changes to collection days over the Christmas period and bank holidays.

Paper copies of the waste calendars are available for those that do not have web access. These can be picked up from the District Council's Town Centre Shop and Elmfield offices in Witney.

As well as bin collection information, residents can use the alerts service to receive information about planning applications registered near to their homes.

Litter Pick**Jen-Lou Marks Foxburrow Lane**

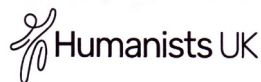
