### Gigaclear is coming to Hailey to extend the availability of super-fast broadband

Since 2010, Gigaclear have been working closely with rural communities across England to bring fibre-to-the-premise (FTTP) broadband to where it is needed most. As part of their broadband rollout programme Gigaclear are planning their network build to include Hailey This should make available a much faster and more reliable broadband service. Just like other utilities, building their network involves digging trenches on private land (with permission), the carriageway, verges, and paths.

In the coming weeks, you may see their contractors in the area validating their plans. Validation is when they walk the mapped-out route, identifying details within the plans that may need adjusting to make sure that they can build as planned. They are also in the process of confirming whether Hailey residents and businesses are eligible for the Government's Rural Gigabit Connectivity (RGC) Programme which helps to finance this initiative. Once this has been determined they will provide further details. Gigaclear are writing to all residents included in the build programme asking for expressions of interest. You will not be committing to anything by doing this.

Please be aware of this proposed new development. A planning application is due to be submitted for a 140-acre solar park on land between St. Johns Lane – Singe Wood and Akeman Street, Ramsden. In recent months many of you will have been enjoying the countryside exercising around this area.

The cost of solar panels and therefore construction of solar farms has decreased hugely over recent years. This has allowed large landowning businesses to see solar park installations as a more profitable alternative to conventional farming. With current planning policy very much in favour, it is especially important that planners should be made to give good consideration to the location of all proposed new solar parks. This can only be achieved through a collective voice.

We are all aware that green energy is key to all our futures. This is not the same as the community involved Southill Solar at Charlbury. This is big business interested in big profits and ultimately represents industrialisation of the countryside.

### North Leigh Roman Villa Volunteers feature on English Heritage's main website

We are a new group of volunteers, only beginning last summer, so it has been quite a first year to get going in. Our aim is a simple one: to help as many people as possible safely to enjoy North Leigh's mosaic again.

Once restrictions started to ease in July, English Heritage adapted their risk assessment for Covid safety, turning our site into a "Covid secure venue" - we still called it "the villa". We quickly agreed a simple system for access to the mosaics: timed slots, family groups, and numbered raffle tickets to monitor admissions!

We got very fortunate with the weather: every one of our 3 Open Weekends, and handful of Special Openings for local Primary Schools and clubs and societies, have been sunny and dry. So at least the libations to the weather gods worked.


The results speak for themselves: over 1,250 people have seen the mosaics this year (nearly double what we managed last year); donations up six-fold on 2019 to nearly £950; and our "Friends of the Villa" are up 50% too.

Happiness was in short supply this year and we helped provide some and reaped a little ourselves. ### **Fires and Bonfires**


