Updates on Parish Council work

Election news

Graham Knaggs has been re-elected Chairman of the Parish Council and Andy Smith as Vice Chairman. Thanks to both for the work they put in throughout the year (along with the rest of the councillors) to ensure Hailey continues to be the vibrant and well-maintained place that it is.

Proposal for development at Giernalls Triangle

Sovereign, who manage Towns End, are proposing to seek planning permission to build 22 affordable homes on land at the end of Giernalls Road. Construction is planned for 2022 with occupation in 2023. Draft plans and a description of the proposal have been published on their web site - https://www.sovereign.org.uk/developing-homes/giernalls-road. They aim to submit a planning application by the middle of the year.

The PC have re-iterated previously made comments (when planning permission was first granted):

- the development should be constructed as a Close with no access to the neighbouring field.
- the PC is concerned about the state of Giernalls Rd and asks that it is made good after the construction traffic has left.
- the bridleway is maintained as it is.
- the PC is disappointed that there are no affordable houses and believes there are too many large houses.
- there should be a speed limit of 20mph during construction

Other PC comments include:

- The number of affordable houses proposed is welcome but it was disappointed that there are no social houses.
- Footpaths should link the development to the bridleway running across the end of the Recreation Ground. There is an opportunity to create a footpath from the Towns End entry to the development, along the rear of the gardens of 6 -16 Towns End properties into and through the copse.

Village Tea Picnic in Breach Wood Hailey from 3 – 5pm on Sunday July 11th with a back-up option, in case of bad weather, on Sunday July 18th.

Very informal; Bring your own picnic; Bring chairs, rugs and games; Lifts can be arranged.

This would provide us all with an opportunity to meet and say hello to people we have not seen for ages; to greet and introduce ourselves to people new to the village over the last 18 months; and to say thank you to everyone who has helped us over the last weeks and months. It would also be a chance to remember those who have died in the last year or so, be they from the village or further afield. In doing this, we thought we would have a huge bag of fir cones available, which people could take and put in a special place of their choosing, around the woodland, and in the following weeks could visit that spot, and think of special memories and thoughts.

It may mean that in 100 years there is a pine forest in Hailey, but that would be fun! So, please start collecting fir cones, and bring them along on the day.

- The PC would like to submit a \$106 request for a contribution towards the cost of a new Village Hall.
- The copse at the eastern end of the site offers a sensible route to the bridleway but will require some tree maintenance and ground work. This would provide a safe direct route to the school and the centre of the village. As far as possible the blackthorn hedge between the site and the recreation ground should be preserved.
- Hailey is a Dark Skies area so there should be no bright street lights.

This development is still at the proposal stage and Sovereign will be consulting with the parish before a formal planning application is submitted.

Local news

Witney Police Station front counter provision

Following a review/consultation, it has been confirmed that the front counter provision at Witney Police Station will be closed officially from end of August 2021 (it has been closed since March 2020 due to the pandemic).

County and District Council News

Following elections on 6th May, Liam Walker has been re-elected as the County Councillor for Hailey and Colin Dingwall has been elected as a new District Councillor (along with Gill Hill who remains as District Councillor). Congratulations to them both and we look forward to working with them. We have worked closely with Cllr Walker over the last few years and intend to continue this working relationship over the next four years, for the benefit of Hailey parish.

Works have started, with the green box plinth installed near Vine Farm. No further works are scheduled until June.

Joan Smith Educational Charity Meeting

This charity exists to help young people under the age of 25 who live in the Parish (or a parent does) with the costs of educational expenses or to assist with entry into a profession, trade or calling. Examples of help previously provided include contributions towards computer equipment, musical instruments, expeditions, music lessons, tools, specialised clothing, etc. Requests for grants are NOT means tested. 
