Vacancies for Parish Councillor

Come and join us

Your Parish Council is looking for two new members to fill current vacancies. All of our existing Councillors are listed on the parish website with their contact details; they would be delighted to hear from you for an informal chat. You can also look at previous agendas and minutes or sit in on a meeting to get a fuller flavour of our activities.

Hailey Parish Council represents around 1200 local people and has an annual income of over £30,000 derived mainly from the 'precept' which is collected with the Council Tax. We maintain the recreation ground, various trees and all the green space including the burial ground; we also make grants to local causes. We manage, maintain, and develop the allotments and playground. We also receive around 30 planning applications annually and comment to the West Oxfordshire Planning sub-committee, supporting or objecting to new applications.

We liaise with the County Council over roads and transport, with the Police over crime and public safety and with a wide variety of other bodies whose activities impact on our village.

How do we work?

We meet monthly throughout the year. Individual Councillors take a lead in various subject areas and follow these up on behalf of the Council. We have a website to keep everyone up to date. There is public time at the monthly meeting for residents to set out their concerns on particular topics.

What would be my time commitment?

In addition to the monthly meetings and time needed to prepare for them, you should probably expect about one or two hours a week.

Do I need special qualifications?

The main qualifications are enthusiasm, commitment and a genuine desire to make Hailey a better place. It helps if you are a 'people person' who enjoys meeting and talking to local people. You should also not be shy of dealing firmly with outside bodies to represent local interests and of putting your views clearly. You will need a home computer for emails and other documents as that is how most of our work is done.

What do you think I would get out of this?

Councillors are obviously unpaid volunteers. But there is satisfaction in knowing for example that you have helped with a sensitive planning application, that road safety is better

monitored, that the historic fabric of the village is protected for future generations and that local people trust you to be their voice and represent them as best you can.

Every objection is important – numbers really matter

The Burford 7.5t weight limit blocks the river crossing to HGV traffic and creates a 17-mile barrier between Witney and the Northleach roundabout for north/south journeys.

One of the main diversion routes is the B4022 through Hailey.

This temporary ban on HGVs has resulted in many additional lorries driving through the centre of Witney, through West End and on through Hailey and other unsuitable routes. The leaflet you should have received recently asks you to write to Duncan Enright with your comments – see box

We received some unwelcome news from our insurers just recently. As a result of an inspection into the condition of the flat-roof covering a large part of our hall, we have been informed that it should be replaced, and preferably before the worst of the winter weather. Initial quotes suggest that the cost will be in excess of £15,000 with the full cost not known until after work begins. Needless to say, an expense of this size will seriously affect future plans, including investment in audio/projection equipment after receiving internet and will no doubt cause some disruption to hall bookings. A date for work to begin has not yet been agreed. The side and rear doors have been renovated and painted and we hope to start renovation work on the main front doors in the coming weeks.


