HAILEY VILLAGE HALL AND PAVILION FACILITIES

As was promised earlier this year, this is an update on progress regarding our work looking at our village hall and pavilion facilities.

Having taken a step back in our approach, we are now looking at several options that are available to us, including: full new build, full refurbishment, a mix of refurbishment and new build (only where necessary), or do nothing.

In order to help decide the best way forward, we now need expert help in some areas. We have recently undertaken a tender process and have now appointed an architect who has significant experience and expertise in similar scenarios, who will help us with some of the work. Note that any costs associated with this will be covered by existing funding that has already been allocated.

We will also -crucially- need your help! In the early new year, we will commence an iterative public consultation process. We will publicise more details about that here in the Hailey Herald and through the Hailey Village Facebook page beforehand so please keep an eye out - and please do get involved! Our initial meeting is being planned for the afternoon of **Sunday 29**th **January**, so please pencil it in.

We will be asking the architect to provide a feasibility study that will look at our existing infrastructure (the "as is" situation) and help to identify the options available to us, associated potential costs, associated funding options, etc. which will fully consider our consultation process.

WINTER WORRIES - LOOKING OUT FOR EACH OTHER

With the current worries about the rising cost of living, rising energy bills, etc. everyone will be thinking ahead to the colder winter months. Much of the following advice may seem obvious to many, but it is all still worth considering and sharing:

- Wrap up warm Several thin layers of clothing are better than one thick layer (socks, T-shirts, etc.)
- **Keep the cold out** Make sure you close doors and block any draughts. Closed curtains and shutters also help to keep the warmth in
- **Hot drinks and meals** Regular cups of tea, coffee, soup, porridge, stews, etc. will help to keep you warm. Try to have at least one hot meal per day
- **Don't drink alcohol to keep warm** Although it makes you feel warm by expanding blood vessels, it actually draws blood away from vital organs
- Check your house heating system Make sure your heating system works well and efficiently and boiler is regularly serviced
- Clever heating Keep living areas heated during the day and warm bedrooms just before bedtime, ideally at 18C-21C. The rest of the house can be lower, around 16C when not in use
- Hot water bottle or heated blanket Use one or the other (not both) and make sure heated blankets have been safety tested (about 20% fail safety checks)

- **Open fires** If you have a log/coal fire, this is a great way to heat your home. Of course, do make sure you've had your chimney swept recently
- **Keep moving** Sometimes this can be easier said than done, but it really does help to build resilience
- Flu and Covid jabs These are free and they offer effective protection against infection Please do continue to keep an eye out for each other, especially if you know of elderly or vulnerable people nearby. As well as the advice above, there are many other useful sources of information available:
 - Lamb & Flag Matt and the team at the pub have kindly offered that anyone who wants to pop in to warm themselves up should do so – they normally have a log fire on the go when they are open
 - Church The church is also open to all as a warm space on Sundays from 9am-5pm
 - Warm Spaces (UK) The <u>www.warmspaces.org</u> website has an online directory of "warm banks" across the UK that is growing and growing. Well worth keeping an eye on if you are planning to be out and about
 - Hailey Relief In Need This small local charity is focussed on Hailey parish and may be
 able to help those who need it most. Funds are very restricted but could offer support to a
 small number of households. In the first instance, you can find out more from Pam Simpkins
 by phoning 868626 or popping a note through her letterbox at Holmlea in Delly End
 - Government help The government is stepping in to help in certain circumstances such
 as the Energy Bills Support Scheme which will provide a £400 non-repayable discount to
 eligible households and the Energy Price Guarantee which will reduce energy unit costs,
 (both of which are automatically applied to bills, so beware of potential scams saying
 otherwise). Help is normally well-publicised (and regularly changes!) so do keep an eye on
 the news and online
 - Cold Weather Payment This amounts to £25 per week for each 7-day period of cold weather and is available to people who receive certain benefits, such as Pension Credit, when there is very cold weather. More info at www.ageuk.org.uk
 - Warm Home Discount This is a one-off £150 payment available to those living on a low income or pension, automatically paid if your energy supplier is part of the Warm Home Discount scheme or you receive the Guarantee Credit portion of Pension Credit. More info at www.ageuk.org.uk
 - Winter Fuel Payment This is an annual tax-free payment of between £100-£300 that is available to households which include a resident born before 25/9/56, designed to help cover winter heating costs. More info at www.ageuk.org.uk
 - **Beware of scams** If you receive messages (text, phone, emails, etc.) relating to the above, please check with a trusted friend or neighbour before responding as there are unscrupulous people out there. Some of the above payments and discounts are automatic, not requiring any action from you

In the last month, the I^{st} team have played three matches with two wins and a defeat. First of all the defeat came at the hands of Adderbury Park in the Oxfordshire Charity Cup, the score was 3-2. This means that Hailey will be unable match last year when they reached all Cup Finals they were eligible to play in. In defence of the Oxfordshire Junior Shield it started with a 2-1 win at Minster Lovell. In the Premier Division they won 4-2 at Milton under Wychwood.


