To vote in person, voters must be on the electoral register and bring a suitable form of photographic ID to their polling station. The most commonly used IDs include:

- Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- Photographic driver's licence issued by the UK, Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (including provisional)
- European Economic Area (EEA) photographic ID Card
- UK Biometric Residence Permit
- An identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (PASS card)
- A Blue Badge
- A concessionary travel pass funded by HM Government or local authority

# The Oxfordshire County Council Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for Oxfordshire Hailey Bridleway No. 34 Modification Order 2022

On the 12 April 2023, Oxfordshire County Council confirmed without modification the above order made under section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. The effect of the order as confirmed is to modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by: -

Upgrading to a bridleway the public right of way from the junction with Middletown at OS grid reference SP 3545 1262, running NE along Breach Lane for 863 metres to join Footpath No. 3 at SP 3592 1332.

The first team's results are mixed in the league, they have lost to Enstone Sports and Stonesfield both by a 2 – I scoreline, but have beaten and drawn in their two fixtures vs Charlbury. In the Oxfordshire Junior Shield, Hailey beat Enstone Sports 3 – 0, but played the same opposition in the semi-final of the Fred Ford Memorial Cup and lost 3 – I, ending our dominance in that competition. The result in the Oxfordshire Junior Shield means Hailey will play a team from the Banbury and Lord Jersey league, Gravenhill, on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> April at Court Place farm, the home of Oxford City, which is just off the northern bypass. K.O 7.30pm. Should Hailey win, they will be the first club in 108 years to retain the title. Hailey's grip on the premier division is in some doubt.

Our reserve team continue to struggle, they have drawn against Ducklington 2-2 but lost to Tower Hill 2-1 and also to Chadlington 2-1. The reserves have reached the final of the Jack Busby Memorial cup with wins against Leafield Reserves 6-1 and in the semi-final against Witney Royals Reserves 2-1. They will play Chadlington Reserves in the final at Clanfield on Tuesday  $25^{th}$  April. K.O. at 7.30pm.

The third team have manpower struggles and have forfeited a few games. The weather has played a part in fixtures being cancelled for all of our teams.
